Chaplain (COL) Douglas H. Fleischfresser is currently serving as the IMA Medical Command (MEDCOM) U.S. Army Reserve Chaplain, serving in the MEDCOM Command Chaplain's Office at Fort Sam Houston, San Antonio, Texas. As the IMA MEDCOM Chaplain he serves as adjunct advisor to the Office of The Surgeon General (OTSG) on all matters as they pertain to religion, morals, and the morale of MEDCOM as impacted and affected by religion. Prior to this post he served as the Wisconsin Army National Guard State Command Chaplain.

Chaplain Fleischfresser earned a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology from Concordia College - Milwaukee, a Master of Divinity from Concordia Seminary, St Louis, MO., and a Master of Science - Counseling from the University of Wisconsin - Whitewater. He is a graduate of the Chaplain Basic Officer Leadership Course, Chaplain Advanced Course, Chaplain Captain Career Course, Brigade Chaplain Qualification Course, Command and General Staff College, Chaplain Lieutenant Colonel Course, and Chaplain Colonel Course.

Chaplain Fleischfresser was sworn into office of the Wisconsin Army National Guard (WIARNG), in the 2nd Battalion, 127th Infantry, as a Battalion Chaplain in 1991. He served there as Battalion Chaplain until 1994, when he transferred to the Illinois Army National Guard, serving as Battalion Chaplain for the 1st Battalion, 123rd Infantry - Air Assault, and the 1st Battalion, 123rd Military Police. He then served the 33rd Area Support Group, deploying to Afghanistan in 2004, serving as Theater Command Base Operations Chaplain. In 2005 Chaplain Fleischfresser returned to the Wisconsin Guard to serve in the 64th Troop command, and then served as the 32nd Infantry Brigade Combat Team (IBCT) Command Chaplain deploying to Iraq in 2009, serving as the Joint Area Support Command Chaplain and Command Chaplain in the International Zone in Baghdad, Iraq. On September 1 of 2012, he was selected to serve as the WIARNG State Command Chaplain and promoted to Colonel on June 1st, 2013. He served in that role until September 28, 2018, when he transferred to his current position as IMA Medical Command (MEDCOM) U.S. Army Reserve Chaplain.

Chaplain Fleischfresser's military awards include the Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (2nd Award), Army Commendation (3rd Award), Army Achievement Medal, Army Reserve Components Achievement Medal (9th Award), National Defense Service Medal (2nd Award), Iraqi Campaign Medal with Campaign Star, Global War on Terrorism - Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Medal with M Device (2nd Award), as well as other federal and state awards.

Chaplain Fleischfresser is a pastor of Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC), and a Licensed Psychotherapist serving with Lutheran Counseling and Family Services in Oshkosh, WI. He is a life-member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post 2260, Solveson-Moos-Abrahamson.
